

II. BACKGROUND INFORMATION FOR LEARNERS

Introduction

This quarter is an overview of the festivals and different theatrical forms of the Philippines. Through the lessons, you will identify the musical characteristics present in Theatrical forms and Festivals of the Philippines.

I. Philippine Festival and Theatrical Forms

Festivals are mostly celebrated to propagate the cultural heritage of a city or a nation. While Theater is a play or other activity, or presentation considered in terms of its dramatic quality.

Here are the examples of the different Philippine Festivals and Theatrical Forms.





DINAGSA FESTIVAL



1. <u>Moro-moro</u>, it is a street drama that usually lasted for several days, and presented both secular themes like love and vengeance, and the Spanish-influenced religious theme of the conflict between Christians and Moors.

2. Another performing art stemming from religious custom is the **senakulo** or Passion Play. This is the dramatization of the life and death of Jesus Christ and is usually presented as a community activity during the Lenten season.

3. <u>**Bodabil**</u>, it sounds like "vaudeville", and it is. This form of theater was an American import in the pre-war era, but became uniquely Filipino with the indigenization of the name. Like its American counterpart, <u>bodabil</u> featured a variety of musical numbers, comedic and dramatic skits, and song and dance numbers.


4. The **sarsuela** is a type of melodrama, usually in three acts, that uses alternately spoken and sung words. It was the Spanish influence that started the *sarsuela*, but it was also this colonization that led Filipinos to incorporate nationalistic overtones in the art.
